Human Rights and Democracy Fund

Established by Congress in 1998 for DRL DRL Programs support four pillars:

- Respect for and protection of fundamental human rights
- Inclusive political processes that reflect the will of the people

• Accountable and effective institutions of government under the rule of law

• Vibrant civil societies including non-governmental organizations and a free press

DRL Programs

- Grants Officer Representatives (GORs) & Program Officers serve as the primary grantee contacts for programs.
- DRL Global Programming (DRL/GP) has obligated approximately 1 billion dollars since 1998.
- DRL/GP is currently managing over 400 open grants.

Priorities

DRL funding priorities are guided by US policy priorities as outlined in:

- Country narratives in the Department of State's International Religious Freedom and Human Rights Reports
- Priorities identified by the President, Secretary of State, the Department, the Ambassador at Large, and DRL

Congressional Support for Religious Freedom Programs

In fiscal years 2016, 2017 and 2018 Congress directed \$20 million per year for religious freedom programs.

Government Constraints

restrictive laws, policies, regulations, or actions that discriminate based on religious identity/beliefs or unduly restrict religious freedom



Religious Freedom

Societal Constraints

discrimination, harassment or violence directed at individuals on the basis of their religious identity/beliefs

International Religious Freedom (IRF) Program Examples: Addressing Government Restrictions

- Strengthening advocacy for legal change
- Building government capacity to reduce restrictions on religious freedom
- Training legal sector actors on religious freedom law

IRF Program Examples: Addressing Societal Restrictions

- Peacebuilding and mitigating societal tensions and conflict
- Civil society coalition-building
- •Countering social discrimination of religious minorities

Department of State Terms and Conditions

Who is Eligible to Apply?

- US and foreign non-governmental organizations (NGOs)
- Foreign Public Entities (FPEs)
- Colleges, Universities, Institutions of Higher Ed.
- For-profit organizations (with certain conditions)

DRL Program Scope

• Length of projects: 24-36 months

• Funding amounts: \$500,000 - \$1,000,000

• Partnerships between organizations are encouraged when applying

Application Process

• DRL allocates foreign assistance through a fair, open, and competitive solicitation process

• DRL does not accept unsolicited applications

Technical Requirements for Applying

Applications must:

- Be in English
- Include budget figures in U.S. dollars
- <u>Follow</u> the Proposal Submission Instructions (PSI) provided with each announcement to avoid technical ineligibility

Paneling and Review

• Grants Officer determines if technical requirements are met.

• Applications are reviewed by an interagency panel and provide conditions/recommendations.

• Issuance of awards depends on final Grants Officer review and approval.

Timeline

• NOFO season is generally October-December with decisions released in spring or summer the following year

• Implementation usually starts in summer/fall
