## U.S. Policy and Freedom of Religion or Belief in North Korea

## **Panel**



Ambassador Robert R. King served as Special Envoy for North Korean human rights issues at the Department of State (2009-2017). Since that time, he has been senior advisor to the Korea Chair at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), a senior fellow at the Korea Economic Institute, and a board member of the Committee for Human Rights in North Korea. Previously, King served for 25 years on Capitol Hill (1983–2008) as chief of staff to Congressman Tom Lantos (D-California), and staff director of the House Foreign Affairs Committee (2001–2008). King is author of Patterns of Impunity: Human Rights in

North Korea and the Role of the U.S. Special Envoy, and with Gi-Wook Shin he edited The North Korean Conundrum: Balancing Human Rights and National Security (both published by the Walter H. Shorenstein Asia and Pacific Research Center at Stanford University, 2021).

**Shirley Lee** is a consultant for Korea Future. She co-authored "Freedom of Religion, Thought, and Conscience in North Korea," released by USCIRF in 2022. Previously, she was a researcher at Leiden Asia Centre and Leiden University in the Netherlands. Her expertise on North Korea was honed through a decade of working with and interviewing North Korean escapees from a wide range of backgrounds, including former high-ranking officials. She holds a MA from the University of Oxford and is currently working on a doctoral dissertation.



**Inje Hwang** is an Investigator at Korea Future where he gathers and analyses evidence of religious freedom violations. He holds a Master of Arts from the University of Kansas and is pursuing a Master of Arts at the Academy of Korean Studies.



**Jinmyung Choi** escaped North Korea in 2017 after experiencing torture by North Korea's Ministry of State Security. He travelled through China, Vietnam, and arrived in South Korea with the aid of a Christian missionary organization. He is now pursuing a law degree in Handong Global University, South Korea, and seeks to become a legal professional.
